Clinard and Richard Russell, will soon appear in form from Reminiscing Books of Asheville. A copy, which will be placed in the Rhodes Room of the Catawba County Library in Newton, should be on every local historian's shelf. The is based on the L. N. Clinard Papers, letters written to Livingston Clinard, a merchant of Salem, N.C., which are now on file at the state archives in Raleigh. True to history, most of the original spelling and grammar was retained by the Clinard compilers, who no doubt had a mammoth undertaking, organizing and transcribing these handwritten gems.
